Tarleton TAFE Heads to National Competition



Four students from Tarleton State University's Texas Association of Future Educators (TAFE) chapter are headed to Orlando, Florida, this June after qualifying for the Educators Rising national conference. Their outstanding performance at the Teach Tomorrow Summit state conference in Galveston this February earned them a spot at the national level — and the pride of their campus community.

Representing Tarleton State at the national competition are Abby Graham, Journey Harris, Madison Klement, and Mariann Pustejovsky. The students will compete in a range of events, including Educators Rising Moment (Graham); Impromptu Speaking, Interactive Bulletin Board — Elementary, and Public Speaking (Harris); Public Speaking (Klement); and Creative Lecture (Pustejovsky).

In addition to these individual achievements, the Tarleton State TAFE chapter brought home the Outstanding Chapter award, a testament to its rapid growth and campus impact since its formation in fall 2023. The chapter even hosted last year's area competition and continues to set the bar high for future educator organizations across the state.

TAFE: More Than Just a Competition

"The national conference is more than just a competition — it's a celebration of passion, dedication and the future of education," said Journey Harris, Tarleton State TAFE president. As the national TAFE president, she is thrilled to return to nationals alongside her chapter, noting how the experience continues to fuel her growth and leadership as an aspiring educator.

Madison Klement, a Tarleton senior and teacher resident, echoed that enthusiasm. "I'm excited for nationals because as a teacher resident, I truly believe what my speech is about. It's especially exciting since it is my last year to compete," she said. "I hope to continue positively representing Tarleton State's education program as an alumna."

Dr. Lesley Leach, Dean of the College of Education, praised the students' success: "This achievement reflects the students' passion for education and commitment to excellence — two essential qualities of outstanding teachers. We wish our students the best of luck at nationals!"

Dr. Katherine Jones, College of Education Assistant Professor and TAFE competitive adviser, emphasized the significance of this year's competition. "This year's Teach Tomorrow Summit state conference was the largest in TAFE history, with more than 3,700 Texas high school and collegiate competitors. Our recruitment table attracted over 400 students, allowing us to showcase the value of a Tarleton State education."
