RECRUITING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO A CAREER IN TEACHING: IT MATTERS WHERE YOU LOOK AND WHAT YOU DO

Dr. Doug Hamman, Teacher Education Department (TED), Texas Tech University

Nationwide, teacher shortages increase each year while interest in the profession of teaching seems to be at an all-time low. Texas schools are also understaffed, and the demographic representation of teachers often does not match the demographic make-up of schools. Policy makers are beginning to see value in cultivating interest in teaching in the form of Grow Your Own teacher programs in middle-level and high schools. In this session, participants will evaluate current practices for recruiting new students to teaching pathways and develop strategies that could support development of an inter-organizational system that supports a pathway to teaching for high-school-aged adolescents.





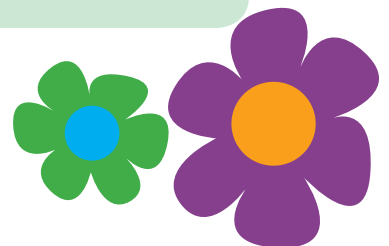

Dr. Sampson is a Nationally Certified Counselor, Licensed Professional Counselor and a Certified School Counselor, having worked at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. Additional areas of certification include social studies, special education, and school administration. He spearheaded the formation of and serves as the faculty advisor for the first ever Texas Association of Future Educators (TAFE)-Texas A&M International University Chapter. He also serves as the lead for the Texas A&M University System Collegiate TAFE Chapter Consortium.

Dr. Sampson has presented in national and state contexts on School Counselor Advocacy in Counselor Education and Supervision, School Counselors as Change Agents, Gaining Professional School Counseling Competencies through Supervision, The Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT): An approach to addressing student substance use and misuse, and Coping strategies for maintaining positive mental and emotional health during a global pandemic.

His research agenda includes acculturation issues among refugee populations, college and career readiness for ethnic minorities, multiculturalism, infusing social emotional learning during educational transitions, and Person-Centered and Solution Focus Brief Therapy in School Counseling.

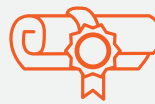
